- EDWARD SAID "ORIENTALISM"






# MICHAEL FOCAULT - JUDITH BUTLER

- CRITICAL APPROACH TO NORMS
- FLEXIBILITY OF NORMS
- analysing and understanding norms and <u>power structures</u> as well as a tool for challenging and dismantling norms

(for example same-sex merriage)

 aware of the power structures in society and your own place within them, while also remaining sceptic about the idea of what's "normal" and make an effort to create space for other voices




